## Huma Sulaiman

hile she's lived all over the world, interior designer Huma Sulaiman had never been to South America. It was pure serendipity that, culling inspiration images, she homed in on a photo that featured a black-and-white checkered floor that conjured up a memory of her client's favorite hotel in her native Buenos Aires. "Everything kind of fell into place from there," Sulaiman says.

She began the design process by swapping his-and-her sinks with the bathtub to improve the room's flow. Now the new focal point is the standalone Victoria + Albert spa tub that underscores the wife's nightly bathing ritual. "With the collage of photographs by Alexander AD and prints by Donald Sultan, it feels more like a living room or an elegant dressing room than a bathroom," says Sulaiman. That impression is reinforced by the Gino Sarfatti brass chandelier, leggy custom cabinetry washed in a custom dark finish and the dramatic occasional seating. Small details—soaring brass-framed mirrors, splashes of red, a profusion of arches, a scattering of antique curios—confirm that perception. Atop that black-and-white marble floor, the result is pure luxury. "I'd never been to Argentina before but somehow I captured its elegance," says Sulaiman.
